TYNI Notes: We have learned that the following popular products will all be *Yoshon* this year:

- All Duncan Hines Cake and Brownie Mixes are Yoshon again this year. (Source: OU)
- This season, all Gefen Cup of Soups will be labeled "Yoshon". If there is no "Yoshon" imprint means it is *Chodosh*. (Source: The Volover Rav)
- Gefen Egg Roll and Won Ton Wrappers are Yoshon. (Source: STAR-K)
- Ungar's Pastry Dough is always *Yoshon*. (Source: New Square Kashrus)
- Post, Kashi and General Mills wheat-only cereals (except puffed or hot) are Yoshon. (Source: STAR-K)
- Gold Medal Flour from plants GF and KC are also *Yoshon* this season, with the exception of Malt and the same old "shared equipment" issue. (Source: AKO)
- All types of Great Value flours except Organic, in all sizes are Yoshon with the mill code of "095".
 This does not include malt. (Source: OU and TYNI Research)
- Regular (crunchy) Oreo Cookies in all flavor varieties are made with winter wheat and are again yoshon for this season. This does not apply to other Oreo products like Gluten-Free Oreos (which are made with Oats) or Cakesters. (Source: OU)
- All raw frozen and baked products from Ostreicher's cookie company will be strictly Yoshon."

- All Jason and Jeff Nathan Bread Crumbs will be Yoshon all season. (Source: OU)

GENERAL YOSHON UPDATES

September 19, 2025 - Update from the Kashrut Agencies

"Here is the latest Yoshon season update – and the actual final season start info:

WHEAT

Pasta products, durum and semolina flours:

- **USA products Aug 1** is the production cutoff date. This means products lists should be updated to reflect Aug 1 as the last production day that one can assume they are Yoshon.
- Canadian pasta products No Chodosh concerns yet.

All Other Flours – A number of mills received Chodosh already. The list online has been updated with all the info we have so far. We are working on updating the lists of all the other mills as well. If we don't have a date listed, you can use **Sept 2** as the default cutoff date. Flours are typically dated 12-18 months and whole wheat 6-12 months.

DISCLAIMER: Sometimes we have found the same label with 12 months and sometimes with 18 months. It is often obvious from the package which one it is (i.e. if the date printed on the package is over 12 months away) but you may need to adjust the date.

Fresh Baked Goods - Should NOT be assumed Yoshon if purchased after Sept 15.

All Other Packaged Wheat Products – Can be assumed Yoshon until **Oct 1**. Will update product lists before then.

BARLEY AND OATS (Raw)

Working on specific info. In the meantime, use **Sept 15** as the packing date cutoff. If the package states it was packed on Sept 15 or earlier, it is Yoshon. For products made with barley or oats, use **10-1-25**.

RYE AND SPELT

Always Yoshon in North America."
